
Safety and General Information

- Connect only SELV circuits to all the communication ports.
- Changes and modifications to this unit not expressly approved by Schneider Electric could void the warranty.
- This External Battery Pack (XLBP) is for Professional Business Applications and not for Consumer Applications.
- This XLBP must be installed in dedicated IT environments only.
- The battery module typically lasts for 10 years. Environmental factors impact the life of the battery module. Elevated ambient temperatures, poor quality utility power causing frequent short duration discharges will shorten the life of the battery module.
- Replace the Replaceable battery module (RBM) immediately if the unit indicates battery replacement is necessary.
- Replace the battery module at least every 10 years or at the end of its service life, whichever is earlier.
- The XLBPs should be replaced by qualified personnel only.
- The battery modules can be replaced by the user.

 NOTE: Live swap of RBM should be performed by qualified personnel only.
- If attempting to replace the battery module:
 - Use only APC RBMs.
 - Do not use third-party battery modules.
 - Replace with the same number of battery modules as originally installed in the XLBP.
- APC uses NMC chemistry Lithium Ion batteries. Under normal use and handling, there is no contact with the internal components of the battery module.
- Do not drive nails into the XLBP.
- Do not strike the XLBP with a hammer.
- Do not stand on the XLBP.
- Do not short circuit XLBP.
- Do not place or use the XLBP near heat or fire.
- Do not use a dropped, damaged or deformed XLBP.
- Do not use the XLBP to power other equipment.
- CAUTION: A battery can present a risk of electric shock and burns by high short-circuit current.
- CAUTION: Before installing or replacing the battery modules, remove conductive jewelry such as chains, wrist watches and rings. High energy through conductive materials could cause severe burns.
- CAUTION: Do not crush or dispose off the XLBP in a fire. The cells may explode.
- CAUTION: Do not open or tamper with the XLBP enclosure. Doing so will expose the cell terminals which
 pose an energy hazard.
- CAUTION: Do not open the battery module or mutilate the cells inside it. Released chemical is harmful to the skin and eyes. It may be toxic.
- CAUTION: Failed batteries can reach temperatures that exceed the burn thresholds for touchable surfaces.

Package Contents









- **6** 1. Slide both the RBMs till they get fully inserted into the XLBP.
 - 2. Press the thumbscrew till it engages and turn it clockwise to lock the battery and enable battery communication.

Note: If the thumbscrew fails to engage, then push the battery pack further inside the UPS till it gets fully inserted.



Rotate the BATTERY ON/OFF switch counter clockwise to turn on the battery pack.








Connect Ground and Battery Cables



Connect the ground cable


- 1.Locate and remove the ground screw on the rear panel of both the UPS and XLBP.
- 2.Secure cable lug on one end of the ground wire to the ground terminal on the UPS and the cable lug at the other end to the ground terminal on the XLBP with the screw removed in *step 1*.




Connect a single XLBP to UPS

Disconnecting the XLBP




Hold the cord provided on the battery connector and pull it towards you. The battery connector will get released from the receptacle, disconnecting the XLBP.





Turn the battery switch in clockwise direction, using a screwdriver, to switch off the battery.




Turn the thumbscrew in counter clockwise direction to unlock the battery module.



- Push and hold the thumbscrew and slide out the battery module using the finger grip provided for the purpose.
 - Push downwards for the battery module on the left.
 - Push upwards for the battery module on the right.

NOTE: Support the battery module while sliding out the RBM from the XLBP.



Smart Battery Management

Definitions

- Replaceable Battery Module (RBM): A string of battery cells arranged to produce a battery assembly with a connector. Replacement RBMs can be ordered from our web site, www.apc.com.
- External Battery Pack (XLBP): An enclosure that contains RBM(s) and battery management electronics.
- User Interface (UI): An interface by which a user can interact with the system. This may include an UPS display interface, a network management interface or PowerChuteTM Network Shutdown software.

Note: Do not use a battery module that is not approved by APC.

The system will not detect the presence of a non APC approved battery module and may adversely affect the operation of the system.

Use of a non APC approved battery module will void the manufacturer warranty.

Maintenance

- RBM maintenance: The APC RBM uses Lithium ion battery cells and does not require maintenance.
- Runtime Test (Calibration): This should be performed anytime the steady state load is changed significantly, for example a new server is added to or removed from the connected load.
- Battery health monitoring: The battery energy output and voltage are monitored to assess the health of the installed batteries when the UPS is operating on battery.

 Battery health monitoring is done during a UPS Self Test, a Runtime Test (Calibration), and when the UPS is operating on battery power.

End of useful life

• Near end of life notification: An alert message will appear on the UPS display interface screen when a RBM is approaching the end of its useful life. For configuration details, refer to the UPS Operations Manual.

The estimated replacement date for each RBM is available through the UI.

• Needs replacement notification: The UPS display interface screen shows when RBM replacement is required. The RBM must be replaced as soon as possible.

When an RBM requires replacement, the UPS display interface may recommend that additional RBMs be replaced if they will soon reach the end of their useful life.

Note: Continued operation after the Needs replacement notification may cause damage to the batteries.

Recycling the battery module

1.Remove the RBM from the XLBP or the UPS.

2.Recycle the RBM.

CAUTION: Do not disassemble the RBM.

Recommended actions after installing new RBM or XLBP

The following actions should be performed after installing a new RBM or XLBP:

- When a new XLBP is installed, the Battery status LED illuminates green in both the RBMs indicating that
 the XLBP is detected by the system and is working normally.
 If Battery status LED illuminates either Red or Yellow in any one of the RBMs, refer to "User interface"
 on page 14 for details.
- Verify that the UPS is connected to input power and output power is turned on.
 - Go to the UPS display interface, use the status menus to verify that the UPS recognizes the RBMs.
 - Be sure that the connected load to the UPS is greater than 400 watts. This information will appear on the UPS display interface.
 - Perform a **Discharge Test**.
 - If at the time of XLBP installation, UPS input power is not available, turn on the UPS output from battery power for 30 seconds. This will allow the UPS to detect all installed RBMs or XLBPs.
 Refer to Operations Manual for details on turning the UPS on and off.
 - Allow the system to charge for 24 hours to ensure full runtime capability.
 - Initiate a Runtime Calibration Test through the User Interface (UI).

For details on the following tests refer to the Test and Diagnostics Menu options:

User interface

View Status/Error notifications: The status of connected XLBPs can be viewed using the UPS display interface menu options.

Battery status LED: The Battery status LED indicates three possible states.

- Is not illuminated:
 - The battery module is in sleep state. This is the default state.
- Illuminates red:
 - An internal error has been detected in the RBM.
- Flashing red:
 - Battery module unable to communicate with the UPS.
- Illuminates green:
 - Battery module operating normally.
- Illuminates yellow:
 - Check the LCD display. If the battery mode icon is displayed on the LCD display, then the battery is discharging. Otherwise, an internal error in the RBM has been detected.
 - To clear the detected internal error,
 - 1.Disconnect RBM by disengaging the thumbscrew (located on the front panel of the RBM).
 - 2.Be sure that **Battery status LED** is not illuminating.
 - 3. Tighten the thumbscrew to connect the RBM.
 - If the problem persist even after 3 attempts, then contact APC Customer Support.

System interfaces: Battery status, alerts, and measurements are shown on the UPS display interface screen.

Replace the RBM in XLPB

A RBM should only be disconnected or removed from the XLBP temporarily as part of the battery replacement procedure.

- 1.Refer to "Removing the RBM from XLBP" on page 12 for details
- 2.After installing the RBM, the UPS display interface may prompt the user to verify the status of the replaced battery modules. If the battery module is new, respond YES. If the battery module is not new, respond NO.

Troubleshooting

Issues	Possible Cause	Solution
XLBP Status LED illuminates Red.	Potential hardware error detected.	Remove the battery cable connector from the battery cable receptacle. Re-connect the battery cable connector to the battery cable receptacle. If the issue still persists, contact APC customer support.
Battery module status LED and XLBP status LED do not illuminate	XLBP ENABLE switch is turned off (thumbscrew loosened)	Be sure that the XLBP ENABLE switch is turned on (thumbscrew is tightened completely).
